2. ALPS WEBSITE & VIRTUAL KNOWLEDGE PARK

Our website is now up and running at <u>alps-cetl.ac.uk</u>. The site is very much in its infancy and there's lots of development work to be done on it. At the moment it will tell you more about ALPS, the programme and the staff, and you can also download copies of this and the first Bulletin from there.

To complement our website we also have a dedicated 'building' for ALPS on the Virtual Knowledge Park (VKP). The VKP can be accessed at http://vkp.leeds.ac.uk/ by registered and non-registered users. In the ALPS building (an on-line repository) you will find much more detailed information, including minutes of meetings, plans, membership of ALP Groups etc. Most of ALPS resources are public documents and readily accessible to all users.

3. ALPS STRATEGIC PLAN

The Strategic Plan which will lead all of our work in the ALPS CETL has been approved by the Joint Management Group. ALPS mission is:

"Building on existing strengths across the partnership, the Centre for Excellence in Assessment and Learning in Practice Settings aims to ensure that students graduating from courses in health and social care are fully equipped to perform confidently and competently at the start of their professional careers so improving the standards of care."

Supporting this mission are six strategic aims:

- A1. to develop and improve assessment and thereby learning in practice settings for all health & social care students
- A2. to develop and promote skills of assessors in practice-based assessment
- A3. to develop the role of service-users and carers in practice assessment
- A4. to develop project management and partnership working
- A5. to research, evaluate, disseminate and change professional cultures
- A6. to respond & influence policy changes nationally and internationally

The Strategic Plan will now go to the next meeting of the ALPS Advisory Board for approval. Once the Plan has been approved we will make it available on the VKP.

4. LEEDS METROPOLITAN UNIVERSITY APPOINT TWO ALPS TEACHING FELLOWS

Sara Eastburn and Catherine Coates have recently been appointed to the position of ALPS Teaching Fellows at Leeds Metropolitan University.

7. CETL CAPITAL TOWARDS SKILLS LABS AT HUDDERSFIELD

Cathy Doggett, Head of Nursing, Acting Associate Dean (Learning and Teaching) and Huddersfield University's Lead Contact for ALPS writes,

"High on our agenda in the School of Human and Health Sciences at the University of Huddersfield is further development of the already well established Clinical/Practice Skills Laboratories Suite. We are delighted with the addition to existing provision which incorporates a Simulated Ward Environment, Sensory Stimulation Room, Physiotherapy Laboratories and Podiatry Clinic. Funds from the ALPS CETL Capital contributed towards the new facilities which include a Midwifery Delivery Room, Operating Department and Occupational Therapy Laboratories, which will be officially opened in January 2006 by the Chancellor, Patrick Stewart.

Skill development in students using simulated settings promotes their safety and confidence, preparing them well for assessment and learning during clinical/practice experience. As an integral part of the curricula on health care courses, skills simulation is used extensively within the School. Although mainly uni-professional our plans are to further develop existing inter-professional learning through these facilities."
