## 1. ALPS INTRODUCTION

ALPS is a collaborative programme between five Higher Education Institutions with proven reputations for excellence in learning and teaching in health and social care: the universities of Bradford, Huddersfield, Leeds (lead); Leeds Metropolitan and York St John University College. There are 16 professions across the partnership from Audiology to Social Work, and a wide range of partners including the Workforce Development Confederation, clinical networks and professional bodies.

ALPS mission is to build on existing strengths across the partnership to ensure that students graduating from courses in health and social care are fully equipped to perform confidently and competently at the start of their professional careers so improving the standards of care.

### 2. ALPS UPDATES

## **II. ALPS Additional Capital**

ALPS is delighted to report that we have been successful in our bid for £350,000 additional capital from HEFCE. This award will be used to develop a searchable web-based database/knowledge management tool, featuring the outcomes and competences for each of the professions and courses represented within the ALPS partnership, and an online repository for learning and assessment resources. The University of Bradford and York St John University College were also successful in their applications for additional refurbishment work as part of this award.

- Bid on e-learning submitted by School of Medicine, University of Leeds, to the Higher Education Academy with ALPS quoted as partner (£40k)

## V. Mobile Technologies Pilot Projects

ALPS partners are all busy preparing for or running their IT pilot projects. These pilots will start to identify some of the pro's and con's of using mobile technologies in the assessment of health and social care students in practice settings. They will also help identify the readiness to adopt mobile technologies, and the infrastructure available and required to support it. Partners' pilots will then inform the overall ALPS mobile technologies project due to start September 2006). Leeds Metropolitan and York St John tell us more about their pilots.

### Launch of the Leeds Metropolitan Mobile Technology Pilot

As an ALPS partner site, Leeds Metropolitan University is currently engaged in an initial mobile technology pilot project involving 30 pre-registration dietetic and physiotherapy students undertaking practice placements in a range of hospital and community-based settings between April and July 2006.

The aim of the project is to evaluate the integration of mobile technologies into practice placement settings and to develop and evaluate appropriate pedagogic approaches that exploit the technology to deliver an enhanced student learning experience.

The focus of the pilot is to evaluate the potential for mobile technology to enhance assessment, learning and teaching experiences. MediaBoard software is being used to set up web-based multimedia message boards that both students and tutors can interact with via SMS (text), MMS (picture), or audio files from either a personal digital assistant (PDA) or desktop PC. This will allow students and tutors to record "real time" experiences associated with practice placement learning, whilst at the same time exploit the features available on the mobile devices to record this information in multimedia formats.

The students involved in this mobile technology pilot are MSc Physiotherapy (pre-registration) students who begin a 5-week placement on 24 April, and BSc (Hons) Dietetic students who commence a 12-week placement at the beginning of May; it is hoped that the overlap of these practice placements will foster inter-professional learning and working. Tutors from both disciplines are also involved in the pilot project.

Students are being asked to collect and record information as part of a reflective media blog including information about observations and learning experiences, especially pivotal incidents that support learning via critical analysis. These include inter-professional interactions along with reflections on how they see the use of mobile devices adding value to their work-based experiences. Students will use the collected data to support reflective and reflexive learning experiences that support and enhance inter-professional working, and give them the opportunity to work collaboratively in evaluating the key skills of teamwork, ethics and communication. Although the emphasis of the pilot is on supporting formative activities, the data students collect will be used to support summative university-based assessment processes. For example the dietetic students will collate data in their reflective blogs and showcase this in their practice portfolios as evidence of their achievements in reflective practice, whereas the data collected by the physiotherapy students will be used formatively during a face-to-face clinical debriefing session, and to support the summative assessment for their Integrated Practice module.

#### What next .....

The Leeds Metropolitan ALPS team look forward to disseminating the results of the mobile technology pilot to ALPS partners in due course, and also to presenting the findings of the pilot at the Third Biennial Joint Northumbria/EARLI SIG Assessment Conference (30 August – 1 September). ## York St John University College Moblogging Pilot

In collaboration with the ALPS IT Group York St John University College has launched a £30,000 pilot project to explore the use of mobile phone technology, linked to Blog and Flickr websites, to generate information on student learning in the workplace.

E-learning advisors Gerry Kregor and Mark Dransfield have been working against tight time scales to launch the pilot that is intended to provide information that will inform future ALPS purchasing decisions.

Maria Parks (Occupational Therapy) and Katie O'Byrne (Physiotherapy) will be working with students to evaluate the utility of the systems and identify ways in which the technology can contribute to enhanced assessment of student performance on professional practice placements.

Forty occupational therapy and physiotherapy students will be taking their Vodafone v 1240 handsets with them on placement in early June to gather data and transmit it back to their personal Blog and Flickr sites, where it will be analysed by academic staff. The pilot project team hopes that as well as gaining insight into the barriers the students encounter innovative ways of supporting students on placement will be identified.
