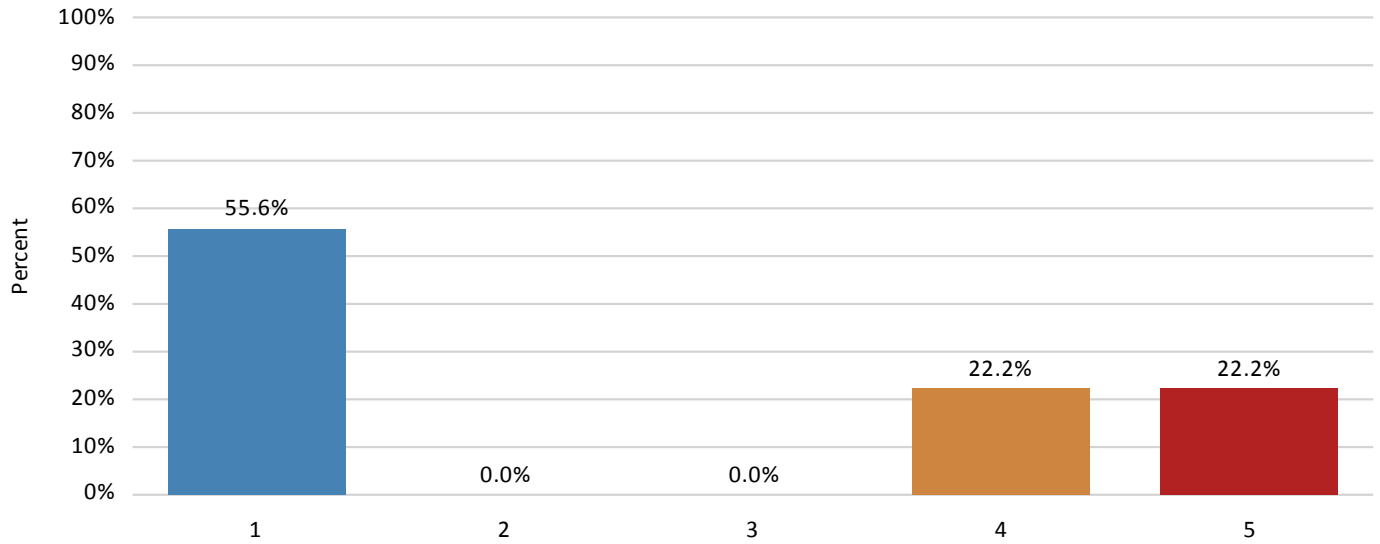

To network and learn more about how to engage service users

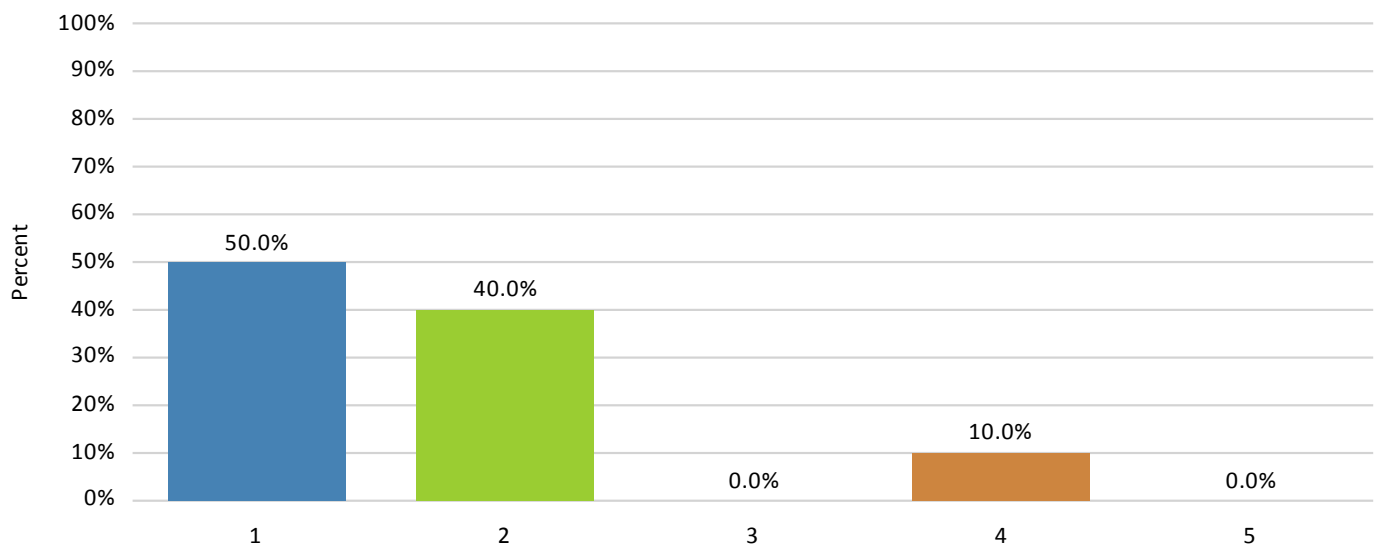
networking with colleagues in the field and update of developments

The approach being developed in the University of bradford - the presentation and discussion really made me think and has given me ideas about how to develop peoples involvement here.

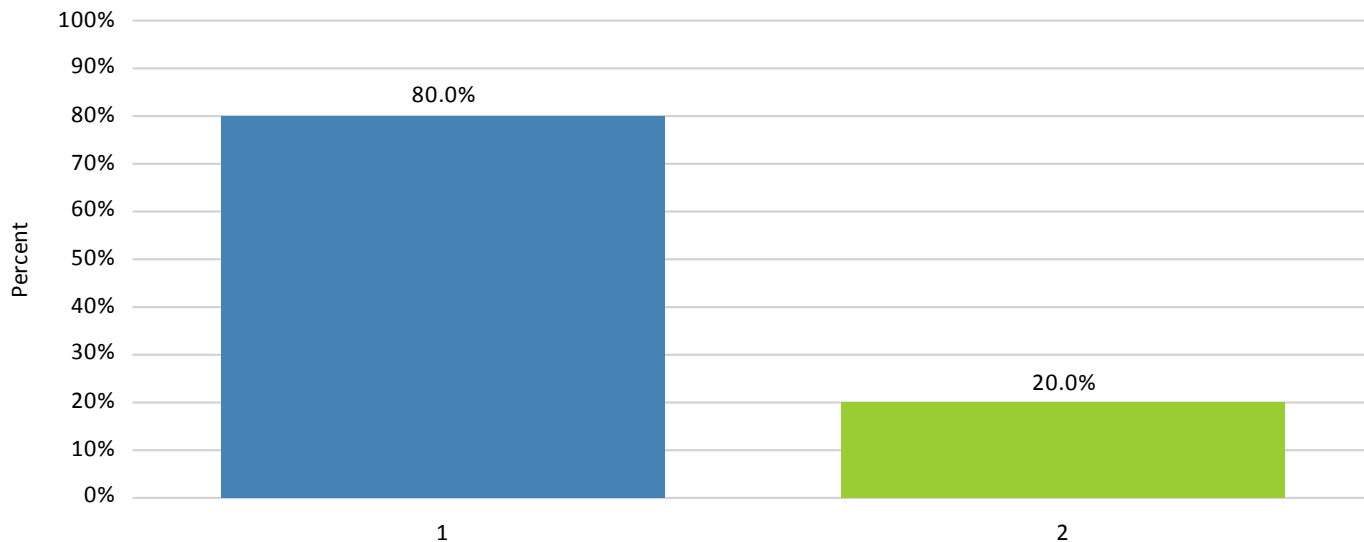
That successful PPI in healthcare education requires the manifestation of a unique identity. This is a researchable subject.

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Excellent as always

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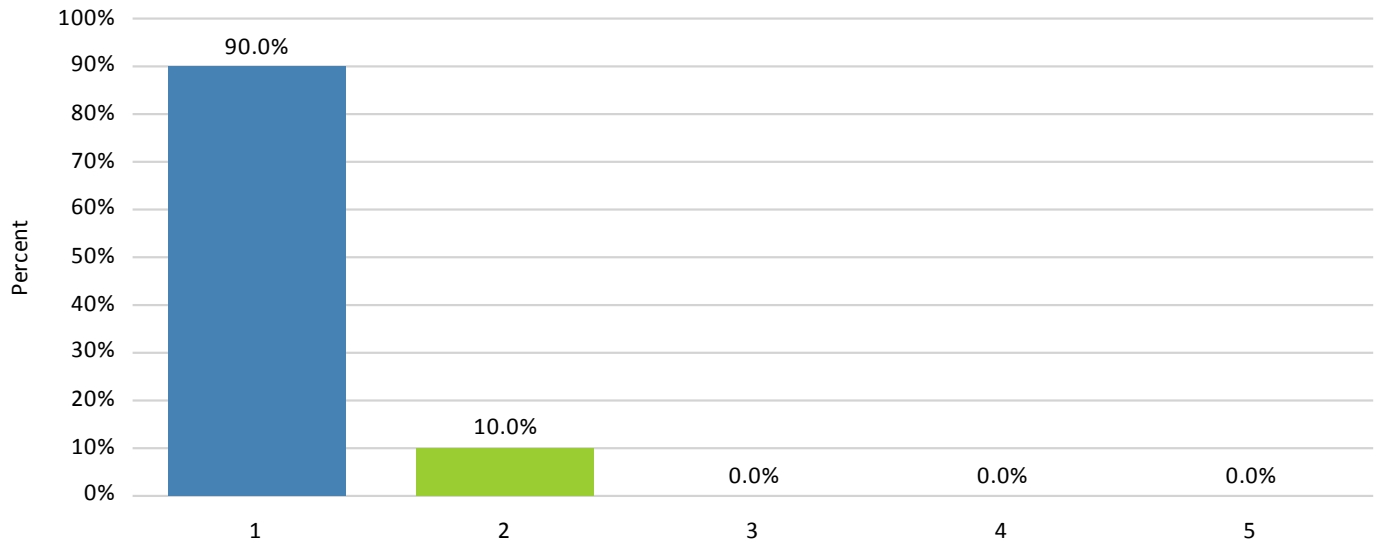
