Supply of medicines in different environments:

The purpose of this task is for you to identify the different methods by which medicines are obtained and supplied in a range of environments. The healthcare professional (HCP) you are visiting may, for example, be a prescriber or may use patient group directions and may use medicines from a stock supply as well as accessing medicines by way of prescription.

Before the visit:

Research the role of the professional you will be spending time with. Consider the way in which they deliver their care and think about the medicines they may need; try to anticipate how they see might access these giving particular attention to the range of methods used.

During the visit:

1. What medicines and related products do you see in use?
2. What restrictions are in place on the range of medicines available to this HCP?
3. Are the restrictions imposed by a regulatory framework or by local policy?
4. Why are medicines restricted in this way?
5. Find out from the HCP how they access medicines and discuss with them the effect of any restrictions they describe.

After the visit:

1. Write a brief report (space provided below) outlining the different methods of obtaining medicines you have seen.
2. Ensure that you understand the terminology that has been used and consider the role of the pharmacist in supplying medicines by different methods.
3. Identify your learning needs and your main learning points from this task.
4. Consider writing a reflective statement about something you have observed today – you may want to reflect on how restrictions in access to medicines affect the way in which care is delivered.
